Ref: My many letters to Chief Secretary since 19/11/2010 after being relieved as Chairman, KSMBL without DPAR issuing any transfer order

Dear Sir,

I learnt today that I have been posted as OSD & Ex officio Principal Secretary (Departmental Enquiry Manual), DPAR in the newly created post.

While thanking you for giving me a posting, it is unfortunate that the posting order has been issued after I submitted my letter to leave the Service directly to H.E the President of India on 4/3/2011 on the ground of retaining my sanity after leaving the Service to fight corruption as I am unable to bear any longer the continuous harassment as it would have made me a total mental wreck.

In my letter sent to GOI directly yesterday, I had indicated to place all letters written by me to the Chief Secretaries of Karnataka as a reply in response to the direction given by Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in respect of a petition filed by Sri TSR.Subramaniam (Former Cabinet Secretary and 82 other bureaucrats) . In fact I have also requested to provide me opportunity to give oral evidence before the Hon'ble Supreme Court to explain the worst possible inhuman treatment given to whistleblowers. I have been facing the most unfair inquiry possible in the history of Indian Administrative Service in the country. This makes me the right officer to prepare the Manual. I would certainly like to use this opportunity so that many other honest Government Servants do not have to face even one per cent of the harassment I am facing in the garb of holding the inquiry that too without taking any action against those whose corrupt practices I have reported. I also found during the deposition how an officer who was allowed swindling of crores of rupees had been let off with a warning and the officer did not even know that DPAR had conducted a departmental inquiry against him and had issued a warning. He learnt about all these things only when I produced a

Legislative Committee Report .In view of the above, the Manual should be so prepared that the honest Government Servants don't get punished unnecessarily and the wrongdoers and in particular the corrupt do not go scot-free. The very fact that a very senior IAS officer like me has been posted to prepare the Manual conveys many things and I understand most of them.

I will do my best to prepare the manual in the shortest possible time using my own experience of undergoing an unfair inquiry and the expertise I have got in various technologies. I

will make every effort to take inputs from all quarters using all possible methods in the preparation of the Manual. I would be needing co-operation from all Government officers and organization and request you to give necessary directions when requested by me.

Even though I would have liked to personally meet you before taking charge, in view of the fact that I have made you a witness in the ongoing inquiry ,(that too as a hostile witness as I have requested the Inquiry Authority and Consultant to compel you to appear and give evidence), **I will not be personally meeting you till the inquiry is completed in all respects as it would not only be improper but also highly immoral. In view of this**, I would not be speaking to you even over phone and I request you also not to speak to me. However, I would be sending Notes in case I require any help or guidance from you. I request you to send written Notes for anything you would like to communicate to me. I request you to give necessary instructions to your personal staff and also to officers to whom I have named as witnesses.

I would personally meet your PS between 11.00 am to 11.30 am today to find out about from where I have to work. I would not be requesting for any assistance of any type due to my horrible experiences in the past. I hope considering the importance of posting a very senior officer that too by creating a new post, all the necessary facilities would be provided without requesting for them.

I would be sending the CTC etc., after I am shown my place of work today.
